

International Training Course on Curriculum Development in Family Medicine

From May 9th until May 20th, the department of Family Medicine (FM) and the School of Health Professions Education (SHE) organise an *International Training Course on Curriculum Development in Family Medicine Indonesia*. This 2-week programme is a combined effort of staff from Maastricht University, external experts, local family medicine practices, the WHIG and the Indonesian Diaspora in the Netherlands.

During an intensive 2-week programme, a group of 23 Indonesian doctors from the National Board of Indonesian Primary Care Physicians 2016 will come to Maastricht. The following topics will be addressed during the course:

- PCP curriculum development;
- Teaching skills and knowledge to train other trainers (Preceptor-Mentorship, Observation based learning-feedback);
- Assessment of the FM-specialist residents;
- Assessment of existing doctors to be equal to the FM-Specialists;
- Quality assurance method of program evaluation.

As part of the programme, the group will have a full day in and around Utrecht, where they will visit the training Institute Schola Medica and hear about the family medicine training from a national perspective. Additionally they will visit FM-practices around Utrecht and Maastricht to get a real life experience of FM in the Netherlands.

The course will conclude with individual presentations by all the participants about the latest developments in the FM-residency training program in each medical faculty.
